T.3915 PUBLIC FORM: members of the public

Mr Stephen Eades (Friends of the Earth) - submitted a proposal to Westbury Town Council. This document states all the facts that are essential if an appeal is needed to the Secretary of State

Mr Eades also said it will be extremely difficult to represent the town to the Environment Agency giving the reasons why Westbury does not the Incinerator. The whole community faces an uphill struggle to convince the Environment Agency to say "No"

Harriet James – The height has been increased from 60ft to 70ft which equates to 140m above sea level. The same as the White Horse. Very concerned about the smoke fumes going over Salisbury Plain. This is a designated area of outstanding area and as designated area for the conservation and protection of lots of rare species.

Margaret Cavanna – There seems to be a lack of understanding who is responsible for what, eg Wiltshire Council, Westbury Town Council and Environment Agency. Cllr Jerry Wickham has written to Hills and Andrew Murrison MP has written to the Environment Agency. Westbury has changed since 2014/2015 (when original planning was passed) for example there is planning for another 500 homes within 750 meters of the plant. Considerable increase in traffic due to the location.

Laurie Oldford – Concerned with the impact on health, especially young families that have moved here. Actually moved from Bath because of concerns with health in a city. Increase in heavy traffic if plant goes ahead.

Zoe Mann – Want Westbury Town Council to know who is responsible for obtaining the ground plume map from Northacre to see where the chimney plume will reach to.

David Levy – Plant will be very dangerous to public health and Westbury Town Council should the lead in the appeal. Politicians are responsible for public health and should act accordingly.

Cllr David Jenkins – Plant will be right next to his back garden and is concerned what it will do to his health. Has watched TV programmes about it and there is evidence that all smoke is nasty. Stop the permit being issued.

RECOMMENDATION received from the TOWN CLERK dated 20th MARCH 2018 to propose purchase of new server with capital money.

Proposal

The network card in our server has failed, a replacement will cost approx. £200.00 but given the age of the server it is not viable to replace the network card and a new server should be purchased.

Background

The server holds all the existing files and provides access to our accounting system. The current server was purchased in 2014.

Clearsky (IT support) has provided a quote based on two options:

Option 1: To provide a basic server with 5-year warranty & installation £3055 plus VAT

Option 2: To provide a higher specification server (faster & heavy-duty case) with 5-year warranty and installation £4504.27 plus VAT

Following discussion with Cllr Cunningham, Option 1 is suitable as a replacement for the existing server and demands of the Council.

Recommendation

Town Council to approve the purchase of a new server (option 1) from the Capital Rolling Fund.
